Decoding the 4 Labour Codes

An online session on labour laws and codes by Dr. Tapas K Panda was conducted on 7th December 2025, covering key aspects like impact analysis on daily wagers, small shops, and vendors. The discussion included existing labour laws in India and the purpose of new labour codes, focusing on social, political, and economic justice, protection of weaker sections, and maintenance of industrial peace. The session also touched upon ILO conventions, including those related to working hours, minimum wages, forced labour, and safety provisions.

The importance of human rights and dignity was emphasized, with references to articles 14, 16, 19, 21, 23, and 24 of the constitution. Real-life examples were cited, such as the Contract Labour Act and issues faced by contract workers. The session also covered laws governing employee relations in India, including amendments and recommendations.

Key additions to labour laws were discussed, including changes to the definition of "industry" and "fixed-term employment". The session also touched upon EPF contributions, wage calculations, strikes, lockouts, retrenchment, and closure. A Q&A session followed, addressing queries on dispute resolution and EPF calculations.

The session provided valuable insights and practical examples, making it a impactful discussion for future implementations. **The discussion on labour laws and codes highlighted the need for effective implementation and enforcement to protect workers' rights and promote industrial peace.** Overall, the session was informative and engaging, providing a comprehensive overview of labour laws and codes in India.

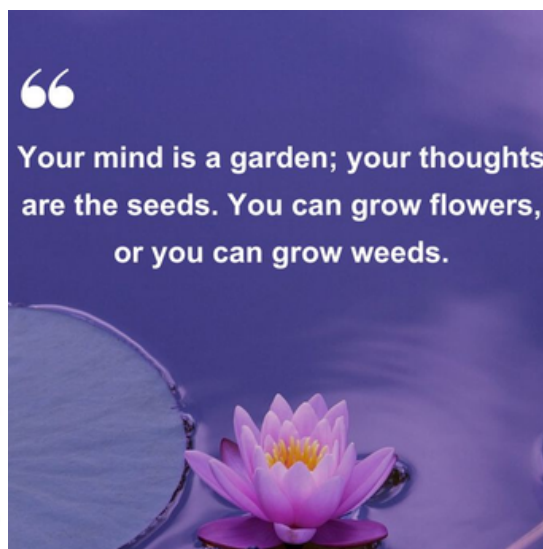

- To connect with Gen Z, brands should engage in meaningful conversations, embrace social issues, and leverage digital platforms. They're influenced by technology, which enhances their experience through convenience and access to information.
- Gen Z values equity, gender equality, and resource sharing. They're ambitious, want challenging assignments, and prioritize purpose over profit. To retain Gen Z talent, organizations should offer flexibility, growth opportunities, and purpose-driven cultures.
- They're not just lazy; they're recalibrating priorities, valuing sustainability, balance, and meaning. Gen Z is teaching us to rethink what makes work fulfilling, prioritizing purpose, impact, and wellness.
